- metaphor:** comparing of two unlike things
- simile:** comparing two unlike things (**like or as**)
- hyperbole:** extreme exaggeration
- personification:** giving human actions to nonhuman objects
- situational irony:** opposite of what is expected to happen does happen
- verbal irony:** contrast between what is said and what is meant; kind of like sarcasm

- allusion:** a reference to a famous person, place, event, or literary work
- foreshadowing:** a hint of what is to come in the story
- symbolism:** when objects represent something else
- alliteration:** repetition of initial consonant sounds
- imagery:** word pictures that appeal to the reader using 5 senses (see, smell, taste, touch, hear)
- onomatopoeia:** using a word whose sound imitates the object being described
- oxymoron:** a phrase that contains two opposing words
