- I have played football since I was seven.

## **Forms of the Present Perfect Tense**

Subject	hove/ngs	Past Vargiciole
I You We They	have	played.
He/She/It	has	promised.

- The present perfect tense is formed with has/have + the past participle form of the verb.
- To make the past participle of regular verbs, add -ed or -d.
- Use have with I, you, we, they, and plural nouns.
- Use has with he, she, it, and singular nouns.

## When to Use the Simple Past or Present Perfect

- Use the simple past tense when the action started and finished in the past.
- Use the present perfect tense when the action began in the past but continues into the present.
- We often use the present perfect with time words such as already, since, always, and never.
- We can also use the present perfect to talk about the recent past. Words like just and recently show the recent past.
- We also use the present perfect to talk about repeated actions in the past if the action might occur again in the future.
