## **STEP 4:** CRAFT YOUR THESIS (CENTRAL CLAIM)

The thesis is where you tell readers what your essay is going to be about. The thesis should be a clear, strong statement of the opinion you gave in Step 1. The rest of your essay will support this thesis.

## **STEP 5: WRITE YOUR HOOK**

The very beginning of your essay is called the hook because it "hooks" your readers' attention. The hook should relate to the topic of your essay, but it can take many forms. It can be:

- **1. An anecdote** (a very short story): Describe your relationship to professional sports. Do you watch them? How important to you are they?
- **2.** A surprising fact: Find a fact that will raise your readers' eyebrows. Several surprising facts are included in the article. You can also do some research to find one that is not included in the article.
- **3. A rhetorical question** (a question to which you don't expect an answer): Ask your readers a question that reflects your point of view about the salaries of athletes. Here's one way you could structure your question: "Do athletes really deserve \_\_\_\_\_\_?"
- **4. A quote:** Find a thought-provoking quote that relates to the topic of your essay.
